3	Club Captain	Members Directory	Question was asked who is responsible for updating this as we have leavers and also members who have passed away. It was decided that Members are responsible to update any small changes such as e-mail address and

4	Competition Secretary	Competition entry issues	Still some issues with the admission process so this is being made clearer to members in writing on the website. Jamie will copy and paste written instructions for Willie, IT member, to load
5	IT Member & Competition Secretary	EDS	The Webmaster and Comp Sec advised that they were working on an electronic version of the EDS pre-game entry via the web portal. The electronic version would be available for use in the coming days (and indeed has since been included on the web portal under Quick Links). On occasion, the EDS book may still be used by members.
6	Club Captain	Captain's Day 11.10.25	It will be a shotgun start at 9am. Members can check in from 7.30am. 4 person team game and colors are White and pale Blue or Bavarian Outfit. There will be lots of prizes, a raffle and a complimentary German beer and a German style buffet after. Cost of entry will be €10 including the 2 stripes of raffle tickets at check in. 7	Social secretary	Presentation Dinner – 17 th Jan 2026	The Social Secretary advised that after contacting many hotels, the best offer was from Alexander The Great Hotel in Paphos. They are the only hotel to have waved the venue fee which all others wanted between 1,000 euros and 2,000 euros for alone. Its also offered the best price on buffet at €50pp and an all inc drinks package of €25pp so total to members is €75pp. The hotel is also offering a special room rate of €130 for a double room so would be nice for members to check in early and enjoy the hotel facilities. 8	Members Rep & Competition secretary	MULTI TEE vs DIVISIONS COMP FORMAT	The Committee discussed the pros and cons of the Multi-Tee trial. The Members Rep fed back that the majority of members with whom she spoke to were in favour of the handicap divisions and did not like the current multi tee arrangement with prizes being awarded on tee colour. A significant number wanted medals to be played from white/blue tees. Some were relatively happy. The comp Secretary proposed a reversion to a modified three division basis, wherein a player's WHS handicap would dictate their actual playing division and tee colour. For example, the Cyprus Golf Federation (CGF) entry conditions for the National Order of Merit (NOOM) tournaments are similar, where the player's WHS handicap dictates their playing classification (medal or stableford) and assigned tee colour (by gender). The Committee resolved to trial a four division handicap basis for the remainder of 2025. The Comp Sec agreed to rework the computations from three to four handicap divisions and their corresponding colour tees. The four handicap divisions will apply equally to both genders, and noting the tee colours assigned to both genders per division are similarly slope rated to satisfy our objective for a level playing field. The Committee is acutely aware that the implementation of fairer playing conditions for tournaments may create unfavourably conditions for some players. The Committee seeks to encourage and incentivise new and established player's to move to a higher division based on improving handicap performance, and yet very new and/or

			mature player's may feel a personal stigma having being assigned to a lower division and tee colour based on their current WHS handicap. There is no associated stigma since SVGR remains an inclusive Resort for all playing members.
			The meeting concluded at 1.30pm.
